

# Timeline Kpando Ghana



First settlement of two Akan-speaking groups at Kpando Abanu

Settlement of Akpini at Kpando who joined the Abanu people

Ashanti incursions into Eweland  
Bisi Kodzo (Kodzo Dra), grandson of Afertor Adzagah and son of Bisiaku, halts the Ashanti succesfull (1750)

Ashanti slave raids at Kpando  
Muslims from the North coming to the area for trading and settle at Zongo  
Final war with Peki against Ashanti with help of the British (1861 - 1871)  
German colonial settlement at Kpando Todzi (1886 – 1914)  
Introduction of Christianity

Ho-Kpando road opened 1911  
Bishop Herman College 28 February 1952  
Referendum on integration 9 May 1956  
Independent Ghana 6 March 1957  
Margret Marquart Catholic Hospital 1960  
Lake Volta formed by the hydroelectric Akosombo Dam (1962 – 1966)

Hearts of Lions enters premier league 2002  
Kpando becomes Municipal District 2012

Ewe people migrate from Ketu

1300

1400

Arrival of Ewe people at Notsie, hosted by King Adelã Atogble

1500

Ewe people escaped from tyrannical rule of Notsie King Ago Akoli.  
During long migration three clans united as “Kpekpe Eto” tri-state and call themselves Akpini.

1600

Constitution of 3 divisions at Kpando:  
**Gbodome** (descendent of Asianu), **Atsiafume** (Eko) and **Anyigbe** (Adedze)

1700

1740 Afertor Adzagah (Asianu descendent) becomes leader of Kpando: settlement of Gabi  
establishment of Kpando market  
1780 Kodzo Dra becomes leader of Kpando

1800

1806 - 1836 Kodzo Dra creates a stool and is first chief  
of Kpando: Togbui Dra  
1836 - 1869: Togbui Agbeti Dagadu I  
1870 - 1897: Togbui Nyavor Dagadu II  
1898 - 1925: Togbui Anku Dagadu III

Conference of Berlin 1884: Kpando part of German protectorate Togoland

1900

13/03/1913: Togbui Anku exciled to Cameroon  
1914- 1957: British rule  
1926 - 1948: Togbui Bulla Dagadu IV  
1955 - 1967: Togbui Ablenyi Dagadu V  
1969 - 1983: Togbui Agbeteti Dagadu VI  
1992 - 2006: Togbui Bulla Dagadu VII
